Phonics

Reception have been reading words containing the er and air sounds, words with double letters and longer words.

Year One have continued to 'grow the code', exploring alternative spelling patterns such as y making the igh sound (e.g. fly) ow making the oa sound (e.g. snow), g making the j sound (e.g. giant) and ph making the f sound (e.g. phone). They have also learnt the tricky words who, whole, where and two.

Maths

Reception have been familiarising themselves with coins and our money. They have begun learning the value of coins and compared and ordered them according to their value. They have also learnt their names and enjoyed playing with money in our role play shop!

Year One's focus has been on number facts, including doubles and halves, and the use of these in additions and subtractions to 20.
