Phonics

Reception have been learning to read longer words, words ending in -ing and compound words e.g. farmyard, rooftop and carpark.

Year One have been reading words containing o-e, o and ou which make the u sound (e.g. some/ mother and young), words containing the spelling pattern se which makes the z sound (e.g. cheese), words containing the spelling pattern se and ce which make the s sound (e.g. mouse/fence) and finally the spelling pattern ey which makes the ee sound (e.g. donkey). They have also learnt the tricky words: thought, through, friend and work.

Maths

Reception have been revisiting the days of the week, reciting the names, and ordering them and using language related to time such as 'yesterday', 'today' and 'tomorrow'. They have started to recognise o'clock times on analogue and digital clocks and match these to key events in their daily routine and in stories. Finally, they have been using the language of position and direction, including 'left' and 'right' in the context of games.

Year One have focused on addition and subtraction, specifically in relation to counting on and back, sometimes crossing ten.

A big well done to the whole class for their fantastic class assembly today! We were very proud of you. Thank you to all who helped their child learn their lines and sent in their costumes!




Friends News: Sponsored Readathon over Easter
