Phonics

Reception have been practising reading words with short vowels such as champ, melt and drum. They have also learnt the tricky words: some, come, love and do.

Year One have continued to revise for their upcoming phonics assessment. They have revised the following sounds: ue (blue/rescue), ew (chew/new), u-e (rude/cute) and aw (claw).

Maths

Reception have focussed on 2D and 3D shape this week. The children have been distinguishing between 3D and 2D shapes and exploring their properties.

Year One's focus has been on addition and subtraction. They have used number facts to add and subtract one-digit numbers to/from two-digit numbers. They have been adding pairs of one-digit numbers with totals above ten and sorted out additions into those which they 'just know' and those which they need to work out.

Sports

On Monday afternoon, some children from KS2 went to Guilsborough Academy to take part in a Team Orienteering Event.

Before the orienteering challenge itself, there were some team challenges where the children had to complete a seven-piece tangram and also match up a 5x5 coloured cone pattern with only one person allowed to see the original pattern at a time. These challenges were tough but encouraged the children to work together and understand the importance of good communication and problem solving.



The orienteering event itself involved finding targets (cones) hidden and marked on a map all over the



school playing field and retrieving the correct letter for each cone. The children had to work together in their small teams to find and record the letters in the fastest possible time or complete as many as they could within a 20-minute time limit, with the support of a young leader from GA.

As the Guilsborough Academy playing fields are somewhat larger than our own, this task involved quite a lot of running and each team had to stay together for the whole task, so the 'teamwork' element played quite a big part.

We had five teams of children and West Haddon Primary brought six teams with them too. At the end of the time, teams from East Haddon finished in **1**st and **2**nd places overall and every group managed to work really well together, with lots of encouragement within teams, which was lovely to see.





A big well done to all the children who took part - I'm sure there were tired children on Monday evening. A special congratulations to the team of Maria, Clemmie and Alice (a very late stand-in) as the winning team, and also to the team of Lukas, Millie, Harry and Darcey for finishing in second place overall.
